

COURSE OVERVIEW

This two-day training programme on the main laws in Occupational Safety and Health touches on the salient provisions of the two main Acts of Parliament i.e. The Factories And Machinery Act 1967 (F.M.A.) and the Occupational Safety And Health Act 1994 (O.S.H.A.). The 1970 Safety, Health And Welfare Regulations under the F.M.A. and the 1996 Safety And Health Committee Regulations made under the O.S.H.A. will also be dealt with in detail. It is a programme designed to create awareness of the two laws and to make employers understand the importance of compliance as the basis for creating a safe work environment at the workplace. The course also emphasises on the responsibilities of both workers and employers towards achieving a zero-accident rate for mutual benefit in the employer-employee relationship.
